



WHAT HAVE WE BEEN DOING THIS MONTH?

Gin Group 1

The penultimate 2024 gin meeting was at Karen Edney's where she provided not only some different gins but a table groaning with some lovely cheeses and snacks. This club is not for ladies who calorie count! We tried some Rhubarb Gin alongside some delicious sloe gin from Sipsmith but our favourite cocktail was a White Lady which is made from:

50 ml London dry gin

25 ml Cointreau or triple sec

25 ml lemon juice plus lemon twists to serve

2 tsp of sugar syrup

(egg white optional and we didn't have it!)

It's light and refreshing but has the strength of a martini – so enjoy responsibly!

Method - Tip the London Dry Gin, Cointreau/triple sec, lemon juice, sugar syrup, egg white (if using) and ice into a cocktail shaker. Shake until the outside of the shaker feels very cold, then strain the mixture. Discard the ice, then return the drink to the shaker and shake again until the egg white is frothy.

The subject of the film, a young boy living in Stepney in World War II with his single mother, who was evacuated and subsequently ran away due to bullying, was not on the surface a prime draw for audiences, but the tale of his return to Stepney, and finding his mother, was exquisitely acted, and directed and had everyone fascinated with his bravery, ingenuity, strength and humour. It was true to many historical facts too, which we discovered with research after the film. At the end of the film, instead of the usual rustling of coats and movement to leave first, there was silence for a good couple of minutes. It was powerful and absorbing, and I described at being, instead of the book every book club should read, the film every film group should see. FG
